Bylaws Amendments to Streamline Board Elections

Current Text

3.5 <u>House of Delegates Voting:</u> Delegates may vote only if their appointing eye bank or organization is a member in good standing. Matters coming before the House of Delegates for a vote shall be decided by majority vote of those delegates present at a meeting at which a quorum exists, unless a greater proportion is required by law or these Bylaws for a particular matter. In elections with more than two candidates, a runoff will be held if necessary to achieve a majority vote.

Proposed Text

3.5 <u>House of Delegates Voting:</u> Delegates may vote only if their appointing eye bank or organization is a member in good standing. Matters coming before the House of Delegates for a vote shall be decided by majority vote of those delegates present at a meeting at which a quorum exists, unless a greater proportion is required by law or these Bylaws for a particular matter. In elections with more than two candidates, **those candidates receiving a plurality of votes needed to fill all open positions shall be determined to be elected.**

Rationale

EBAA's officer elections often feature more than two candidates running for a single position, and our At-Large elections typically have three open positions. Requiring a majority vote in these cases results in repeated run-off votes that slow down the proceedings and consume time that could be spent discussing issues of importance to the membership.
