Dear EBAA Colleagues:

I am nominating Jameson Clover, CEBT for a Director at Large position on the Board of Directors of the EBAA. It is a pleasure to write a letter of recommendation on behalf of her for consideration of this position.

The Board of Directors requires a diverse group of individuals with experience, service, leadership, scholarly activities, and character. Jameson fulfills all these criteria in the eye banking profession. I have worked with Jameson on research projects, clinical trials, and optimization of eye banking processes at VisionGift in Portland since 2010 when I joined the VisionGift Medical Advisory Board.

In the area of experience, Jameson has a Bachelor of Science in Biology from the University of Dallas. She served on UT Southwestern Medical Center's Transplant Services Center as a Recovery Technician from 2002-2004. She became and has maintained her CEBT status since 2007. When joining VisionGift Portland in 2004, she became a recovery technician for 2 years and then additionally served as an eligibility specialist for 2 years.

In the area of service and leadership, Jameson has served on multiple EBAA committees and subcommittees including the Statistical Report Committee, Exam Committee, Suitablilty Committee, and the Certification Board. In leadership roles at our home eye bank, Jameson is the current Senior Vice President of Surgical Services and Business Intelligence, former Distribution manager (for 4 years) former Distribution and Eligibility manager (2 years). Jameson has been engaged in teaching at EBAA national meetings since 2014, demonstrating expertise in a broad array of eye-banking topics related to CEBT testing, eligibility skills, and medical director donor evaluations. Her audiences have included both eye bankers and medical doctors engaged in this profession.

Jameson has stepped beyond traditional eye banking roles to advance the field of corneal transplantation with scholarly activities. She is a participant in key clinical trials like the CPTS, DEKS, DETECT pilot, DETECT I and DETECT II, most of which are NIH sponsored multicenter randomized controlled trials. She is a contributing author on 18 peer reviewed publications in high profile scientific journals, 2 book chapters and 7 scientific abstracts presented at national conferences.

On a personal level, I can testify to Jameson's character and integrity in her work ethic and diligence. She is team oriented, focused on excellence, and a prompt, honest, and excellent communicator. I have personally watched her manage with thoroughness various challenges that arise in our eye bank's processes. She demonstrates thoughtful analysis, understanding of missing information, and ability to troubleshoot and identify areas that need improvement vs. processes that are working well. She is polite, creative, insightful, inquisitive and forward-thinking. She is a valued member of VisionGift and one who, frankly, is my "go-to" person when I have questions or concerns.

In summary, Jameson Clover would make an outstanding contribution to the EBAA Board of Directors with her significant experience, perspective, leadership, research and service to eye banking and the EBAA over the last 21 years. I respect her passion, and the heart that she brings to her work. I would categorize her in the top 5% of all eye bankers world-wide. I recommend her for a Board Director-at-Large position without reservation.
